Sola Scriptura means Scripture alone Sola Gratia means grace alone Sola Fide means faith alone Sola Christus means Christ alone
Soli <b>Deo Gloria</b> means " to God alone" The glory of God is one of the most often reoccurring subjects in Scripture as it is mentioned in total and times in the book of Psalms alone.
The Westminster shorter catechism (1647 AD) begins like this: Question: What is the chief of man?
Answer: Man's chief end is to God and to Him forever
Reference: Psalm 16:8 and 9 (English Standard Version)
verse eight, "I have set the LORD always before me; because He is at my right hand I shall not be shaken." In setting God front and center in his consciousness it means David glorified God. Verse nine describes the result of him doing that. verse nine, "Therefore my heart is glad, and my whole being rejoices…"
Question one: What is God's glory?
There are 2 parts to the glory of God  • God's glory God's intrinsic glory is glory that is intrinsic to His nature as God
Reference: <b>Acts 7:2</b> God is called the " <b>God of glory</b> " Reference: <b>Jude 24</b> , "Now to Him (God) who is able to keep you from stumbling, and to present you faultless before <b>the presence of His glory</b> with exceeding joy,"
<b>Definition</b> : God's intrinsic glory is the of His attributes (characteristics) as God
Reference: Exodus 33:17-23 (see screen)

God's glory
<b>Definition</b> : God's indicated glory is the that we give to Him
We cannot add to His nature as God but we can increase His recognition to others around us. Reference: I Chronicles 16:24, 29a; Psalm 29:1, 2b, 96:1-3; Isaiah 43:6b,7; I Timothy 1:17 and I Corinthians 10:31, etc. (see screen)
There are three words Catholics use to describe someone's attitude toward God, saints or other religious statues, icons, images, artifacts, etc.
Latria (Latin) means adoration and reverence directed only to the (God the Father, Son and Holy Spirit).
Doulia (Greek) means reverence paid to the deceased and (in an absolute sense) and in a lesser (relative sense) reverence paid to inanimate objects such as and
The <b>Mosaic Decalogue</b> (see screen) Reference: <b>Exodus 20:2-17</b>
In the Catholic Catechism and most official Catholic documents (see the Vatican website) the second commandment is missing. The command to not make an image to be worshipped is not found in the Catholic Catechism.
Problem: That leaves just nine commandments.
Solution: The Church divides the tenth commandment into
