THANKSGIVING IN THE PSALMS

Reference: **Psalm 107**Pastor Larry Webb

William Bradford was the governor of the Plymouth Colony established in 1620 and located in what is now Massachusetts. The Plymouth Colony was the first settlement of Europeans in New England. The members of that settlement, called Pilgrims, in conjunction with Squanto and other Native American friends, held a three-day feast of thanksgiving and praise to God after their first harvest in 1621. Then, in 1623, Bradford made the first Thanksgiving proclamation. Governor Bradford explained how the Pilgrim population and the Native American Indians made a binding peace agreement. That treaty contained six mutually agreed upon promises:
