Genesis chapters ten and **eleven** teach that all human beings have been divided into four categories:

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verse one, "Now this is the genealogy of the sons of Noah: Shem, Ham, and Japheth. And sons were born to them after the flood."

verse thirty- two, "These were the families of the sons of Noah, according to their generations, in their nations; and from these the nations were divided on the earth after the flood."

verse two, "The sons of **Japheth** were Gomer, Magog, Madai, Javan, Tubal, Meshech, and Tiras."

verse six, "The sons of Ham were Cush, Mizraim, Put, and Canaan."

verse twenty-two, "The sons of **Shem** were Elam, Asshur, Arphaxad Lud, and Aram."

The entire human race post flood has descended from Noah's three sons: Japheth, Ham and Shem

verse ten, "And the beginning of his kingdom was Babel, Erech, Accad, and Calneh, in the land of Shinar."

verse eleven, "From that land he went to Assyria and built Nineveh, Rehoboth Ir, Calah"

verse twelve, "And Resen between Nineveh and Calah (that is the principle city)."
