There are four essential reasons that Paul was able to rejoice in spite of his imprisonment at Rome...

**Essential One...** Paul had a divine perspective on his circumstances **verses twelve** through **fourteen** 

**Essential Two...** Paul focused on what really matters, and what really mattered was the gospel of Jesus Christ **verses fifteen** through **eighteen** 

Essential Three Paul related to his circumstances from a
position of significant spiritual
verse nineteen

Paul got his strength from two sources

One is that Paul was able to cope because of \_\_\_\_\_\_ from his Christian friends at Philippi verse nineteen, "For I know that this (difficult situation) will turn out for my deliverance (or benefit) through your prayer..."

References: Romans 15:30; I Thessalonians 5:25

**Two** is that Paul had \_\_\_\_\_\_ from the Holy Spirit **verse nineteen**, "For I know that this (difficult situation) will turn out for my deliverance (benefit) through...the supply (provision) of the Spirit of Jesus Christ."

Reference: John 16:13 and 14

verse thirteen, "However, when He, the Spirit of truth, has come, He will guide you into all truth; for He will not speak on His own authority, but whatever He hears He will speak; and He will tell you things to come."

verse fourteen, "He (Holy Spirit) will glorify Me (Jesus), for He will take of what is Mine and declare it to you."

There's a fourth reason Paul was able to rejoice
Essential Four Paul's life enabled him to survive his circumstances verses twenty through twenty four
verse twenty, "according to my earnest expectation and hope that in nothing I shall be ashamed, but with all boldness, as always, so now also Christ will be magnified in my body, whether by life or by death."  verse twenty-one, "For to me, to live is Christ, and to die is gain."
"For to me, to live is"
The average person's answer (if honest) is probably going to fall into one of five categories:  •for to me, to live is
verse twenty-two, "But if I live on in the flesh, this will mean fruit from my labor; yet what I shall choose I cannot tell."
Paul had a dilemma and that dilemma is mentioned in verses twenty-three and twenty-four.
One option would be for him to and go to heaven, where he could see Jesus.  verse twenty-three, "For I am hard-pressed between the two, having a desire to depart and be with Christ, which is far better."
The second option would be for him to, where he would be able to minister on behalf of these Christians back at Philippi.
verse twenty-four, "Nevertheless to remain in the flesh is more needful for you."
