THE BIBLICAL RESPONSE TO PERSONAL DEFAMATION

Definition: Personal defamation is a term used to describe a that is made about someone intending to harm that person's reputation.
Personal defamation comes in two basic forms: Definition: Slander is when someone has made a false statement about someone.
Definition: Libel is when someone has made a or false statement about someone.
This message primarily focuses on slanderous defamation.
ONE – we should understand slander is a Reference: Leviticus 19:16; Exodus 20:16; Proverbs 10:18b, 30:10; Matthew 15:18, 19 (see screen)
TWO – we should maintain a at all times. Reference: I Peter 3:16 (see screen)
THREE - we should know we do have biblical permission to to slanderous accusations but it's not always
to do that. Reference: Proverbs 22:1; John 8:48, 49; Matthew 27:11-14; Ecclesiastes 7:21a, (see screen)
FOUR – we should confront the slanderer in if possible. If someone offends us through defaming us then we have two available biblical options:
We can (and most often should) let love that offense (i.e. defamation). Reference: I Peter 4:8 (see screen)
We can go to that offending person and about that offense (i.e. defamation) in hopes we ca
resolve the matter and be reconciled to one another. Reference: Matthew 18:15 (see screen)
FIVE - we should exercise (positional) forgiveness as soon as possible.

Ken Sande in his classic book "peacemakers" argues that human forgiveness is a two stage process: the first stage is called attitudinal forgiveness
Definition : Attitudinal forgiveness is unconditional forgiveness that transpires in our minds and attitudes between and
The second stage of forgiveness is called relational forgiveness. Definition : Relational forgiveness is a conditional forgiveness that transpires once the repents from his sin and offense and asks the person to forgive him.
SIX – we should refuse to in defamation: That means three things in particular
