

HOW TO ADDRESS BIBLICAL DIFFICULTIES - Part II

Bible difficulties are apparent problems found in the biblical record, but this multi-part message addresses ten fundamental principles that can help us better understand the textual problems found in Scripture. But first notice some important groups that emphasize biblical problems and difficulties:

Agnosticism

Definition: Agnosticism is the doctrine that no one is _____ God exists. There are two categories of agnostics:

- soft (or weak) agnosticism means **we** _____ **know** if God exists
- hard (or strong) agnosticism means **we** _____ **know** if God exists


Atheism
