## **SPIRITUAL MATURATION**

Reference: I John 2:12-14 Pastor Larry Webb

There are three distinct categories of Christians mentioned in this passage: "little children", "young men" and "fathers". These group represent three different stages or strata's of spiritual maturation. Question: how does someone grow spiritually? Consider this formula.
X + = a mature Christia
John itemizes three different stages of spiritual growth; and in doing the helps us see where we are in this maturation process.
GROUP ONE Christians verse twelve, "I write unto you, little children, because your sins are forgiven you for His name's sake." verse thirteen c, "I write unto you, little children, because you have known the Father."
These "little children" from verses twelve and thirteen represent immature Christians.
GROUP TWO Christians
verse thirteen second part, "I write to you, young men" verse fourteen second part, "I have written to you, young men"
These "young men" from verses thirteen and fourteen represent maturing Christians.
