There are four specific areas that describe how Paul had been praying for his Christian friends at Philippi:
ONEPaul prayed for them to have a and form of love
verse nine, "and this I pray, that your love may abound still more and more in knowledge and all discernment."
TWO Paul prayed for them to have a commitment to
verse ten, "that you may approve the things that are excellent,"
The word "excellent" in the original language means "to supersede, to surpass, to be better than, to be of more value than, and to in."
DEFINITION: excellence, on an individual basis, is doing what to be done, doing it it needs to be done, doing it the best it be done, and doing that way we do it.
THREE Paul prayed for them to have a sense of
verse ten, "that you may be sincere and without offense till the day of Christ."
Reference: Romans 12:9a. "Let love be without

hypocrisy..."

FOUR Paul prayed for them to be practitioners of
verse eleven, "being filled with the fruits of righteousness which
are by Jesus Christ to the glory and praise of God."
