5)	TEACHING Reference: Romans 12:7
	Definition: the Spirit produced ability to communicate God's truth through a careful and of scripture so as to cause people to both learn and change.
6)	EXHORTATION Reference: Romans 12:8
	Definition: the Spirit produced ability to others especially if they are discouraged and struggling.
7)	KNOWLEDGE Reference: I Corinthians 12:8
	Definition: the Spirit produced ability to discover, collect, analyze organize and retain that is vital to individual Christians or the entire Church.
	The Hebrew word translated as "to know' or knowledge is yada and yada is used more than times in the Old Testament. The Greek word translated as "knowledge" is gnosko and gnosko is mentioned more than times in the New Testament. God puts great emphasis on knowledge.
	WARNING: Be careful! Reference: I Corinthians 8:1b, " Knowledge puffs up, but love edifies."

8)	WISDOM Reference: I Corinthians 12:8
	Definition the Spirit produced ability to God's perspective on people and situations and communicate those insights in a simple and understandable manner.
9)	PROPHECY Reference: I Corinthians 12:10
	Definition: the Spirit produced ability to persuasively communicate God's truth so that itnon-Christians and both challenges and encourages Christians.
	One of the characteristics of the New Apostolic Reformation (or Restoration) movement is an emphasis on receiving extra biblical prophecies. The big problem is that more and more of those prophecies aren't accurate and prophecies that aren't totally true should be considered false prophecies.

	QUESTION: If someone claims to receive a prophetical message that does turn out to be correct does that mean this person has the biblical gift of prophecy?
	ANSWER:
	God has warned us about false prophets References: Matthew 7:15 and Acts 20:29-30 (see screen)

The actual word "prophet" in the original languages meant "to **speak before**" and so a prophet was someone that **spoke before** and a prophet **spoke before** in two basic areas:

1) a prophet spoke about something **before it** ______

That was the same as **predicting** and the *predictive* part of prophesying does not now exist in the exact same sense it did in biblical times. We are able to predict accurately only what God has already predicted in Scripture.

I am a "prophesier" only in the sense I am preaching what God has already said. Once the New Testament was completed, prophesying changed from announcing new revelation from God to announcing the revelation God has already given us.

Reference: **Jude 1: 3**, "Beloved, while I was very diligent to write to you concerning our common salvation, I found it necessary to write to you exhorting you to **contend earnestly for the** (Christian) **faith** which was **once for all delivered to the saints**."

2) a prophet spoke about something **before** an _______ This is the **preaching** component to prophesying and that means a prophet would stand before a group of people and actually preach.

IMPORTANT: preaching (not predicting) is the _____usage of the term "prophecy" in Scripture.

That means in modern times the spiritual gift of prophecy is the **preaching** gift!
