Classification Three V T P
Definition: These individuals our spiritual passion.
Biblical examples:
Reference: <b>Il Timothy 2:2</b> , "And the things that <b>you</b> (Timothy) have heard from me (Paul) among many witnesses, commit these to <b>faithful men</b> who will be able to teach <b>others</b> also,"
Numerical value: a "plus" person.
Classification Four V N P Definition: These individuals our spiritual passion.
The Prato Principle, i.e. <b>80/20</b> principle means percent the average congregation is these very nice persons.
Numerical value: a "" person.
Classification Five V D P Definition: These individuals who us of our spiritual passion.
Numerical value: a "minus" person.
The objective in ministry is to move people up the list to a higher category than they are presently at. Barnabas did that for a very drain person named John Mark. Notice what Paul said about Mark near the end of his own life.  Reference: Il Timothy 4:11, "Only Luke is with me. Get Mark and brinhim with you, for he is to me for ministry."
Mark progressed from a negative (VDP) to ultimately a positive (VRP).
