	st characteristic of an intimate authentic friendship is that a true for his friend
Reference: I Samuel 18:1-4, verse one, "Now when he (David) had finished speaking to Saul, the soul of Jonathan was knit to the soul of David, and Jonathan loved him as his own soul." verse two, "Saul took him (David) that day, and would not let him go home to his father's house anymore." verse three, "Then Jonathan and David made a covenant, because he (Jonathan) loved him (David) as his own soul." verse four, "and Jonathan took off the robe that was on him and gave it to David, with his armor, even to his sword and his bow and his belt."	
The <b>second characteristic</b> of intimate authentic friendship is that a true friend his friend.	
verse (	nce: I Samuel 19:1-5, one, "Now Saul spoke to Jonathan his son and to all his servants, ey should kill David; but Jonathan, Saul's son, delighted greatly
verse t	two, "So Jonathan told David, saying, 'My father Saul seeks to kill nerefore please be on your guard until morning, and stay in a

secret place and hide."

**verse three**, "And I will go out and stand beside my father in the field where you are, and I will speak with my father about you. Then what I observe, I will tell you."

verse four, "Thus Jonathan spoke well of David to Saul his father, and said to him, 'Let not the king sin against his servant, against David, because he has not sinned against you, and because his works have been very good toward you."

verse five, "For he took his life in his hands and killed the Philistine (Goliath) and the LORD brought about a great deliverance for all Israel. You saw it and rejoiced. Why then will you sin against innocent blood, to kill David without a cause?"

The <b>third characteristic</b> of intimate authentic friendship is that a true friend has a to connection to his friend.
Reference: I Samuel 20:41-42, verse forty-one, "As soon as the lad had gone, David arose from a place toward the south, fell on his face to the ground, and bowed down three times. And they kissed one another; and they wept together, but David more so."
verse forty-two, "Then Jonathan said to David, 'Go in peace, since we have both sworn in the name of the LORD (i.e. friendship covenant), saying, 'May the LORD be between you and me, and between your descendants and my descendants, forever." So he arose and departed, and Jonathan went into the city."
The <b>fourth characteristic</b> of intimate authentic friendship is that a true friend is a constant to his friend
Reference: I Samuel 23:16-17, verse sixteen, "Then Jonathan, Saul's son, arose and went to David in the woods and strengthened his hand in God." verse seventeen, "And he said to him, 'Do not fear, for the hand of Saul my father shall not find you. You shall be king over Israel, and I shall be next to you. Even my father Saul knows that."
CONCLUSION: In this ancient friendship, Jonathon acted as a model friend to David; but, there is someone else who is the most authentic and true friend someone could ever have. His name is
