verse one , "My Brethren, let not many of you become teachers…" Essentially, James has given us a warning. He said, "Don't be so anxious to be a teacher."
The reason is not because teachers aren't
The reason is not because more teachers aren't
Question: Why shouldn't all of us become teachers?
verse one (cont'd.) "knowing that we (meaning knowing that we who are teachers) shall receive a stricter judgment ."
This passage argues that those who engage in biblical instruction, those who have been faithful to teach in a Christian context, are going to face a stricter analysis at the Judgment Seat of Christ.
There are at least three reasons why teachers are going to face a stricter evaluation and judgment than those who don't teach.
 A teacher is responsible to teach Reference: 1 Timothy 3:15 (see screen),
 A teacher is responsible to his own teaching. Reference: Hebrews13:7 (see screen)
Teaching falls into two basic categories: i.e. what we say and i.e. what we do.
