HOW TO ADDRESS BIBLICAL DIFFICULTIES - Part IV

This is the conclusion to this series that addresses ten fundamental principles that can help us better understand the difficulties found in Scripture.

ONE - The unexplained is not necessarily unexplainable.

TWO - Someone's flawed **interpretations** of Scripture doesn't mean the Scripture itself is flawed.

THREE - New Testament citations of the Old Testament **do not** need to be **exact**.

FOUR - Difficult passages are to be interpreted by the more **obvious ones**.

FIVE - Doctrine is not to be built on **obscure passages**.

SIX - The fact there might be an error in a **copied** manuscript or translation does not mean there was an error in the **original** autographs.

SEVEN - Just because a biblical text seems to bedoes not mean it is
Question: Did Jesus meet or demoniac's? Compare Mark 5:1, 2 and Matthew 8:28 (see screen) The basis of all logic and all logical thinking is called the law of non-contradiction and that law states that something cannot be both and at the same time. If someone can demonstrate from Scripture a violation of this law of non contradiction then, and only then, can someone prove a biblical contradiction.

Question: Did Simon Peter deny Jesus before the rooster crowed _____ or ____?

MATTHEW'S PREDICTION:

Reference: Matthew 26:31, 33 and 34 (see screen)

MATTHEW'S FULFILLMENT: Reference: **Matthew 26:69-75**

According to Matthew's account Jesus predicted that before the rooster would crow , Simon Peter would deny him three times.
MARK'S PREDICTION: Reference: Mark 14:27, 29 and 30 (see screen)
MARK'S FULFILLMENT: Reference: Mark 14:66-72 (see screen) According to Mark's account Jesus predicted that before the rooster would crow twice, Simon Peter would deny him three times
 Question: Did Simon Peter deny Jesus before the rooster crowed once or twice? Some historians have said that roosters actually crowed at three distinct times in ancient Jerusalem. the first time at about half an hour after midnight (am) a second time about an hour after that (am) and a third time at about an hour after that (am)
Explanation: Jesus first made a statement and told Simon Peter he would deny him before the rooster crowed and then because He felt it was necessary Jesus decided to be more and told Simon Peter he would deny him before the rooster crowed twice.
EIGHT - General statements don't necessarily mean
The book of Proverbs is a prime example of this principle because the proverbs are basically general statements of instruction. That means not each proverb is an absolute truism in all possible situations. Reference: Proverbs 26:4 and 5 (see screen)
NINE - Later biblical revelation supersedes
Revelation is information from God that has been revealed to man and that divine revelation exists in two basic categories: general revelation and special revelation. General revelation is information communicated from God to man through creation, human conscience and
Special revelation is information communicated from God to man through and evangelical Christianity teaches this special revelation was " " in nature.

TEN - Passages are to be understood in their _____.

Probably the most common mistake that opponents of Scripture make is to take a biblical text out of its textual context causing it to be misunderstood. I want us to see four circles of context:
