A person might be a lukewarm Christian if:

- 1. They do not really want to be saved from their sin; they want only to be saved from the penalty of their sin. They don't genuinely hate sin and are not truly sorry for it; they're merely sorry because God is going to punish them.
- 2. They are moved by stories of people who do radical things for Christ, yet they do not act. They assume such action is for "extreme" Christians, not average ones.
- 3. They rarely share their faith with their neighbors, coworkers, or friends. They do not want to be rejected, nor do they want to make people uncomfortable by talking about private issues like religion.
- 4. They gauge their morality or "goodness" by comparing themselves to the secular world. They feel satisfied that while they are not as hard-core for Jesus as so-and-so, they are nowhere as horrible as the guy down the street.
- 5. They say they love Jesus, and He is, indeed, a part of their lives, their money, and their thoughts, but He isn't allowed to control their lives. They do not love Him with all their heart, soul, and strength. That sort of total devotion is not really possible for the average person; it's only for pastors and missionaries and radicals.
- **6.** They feel secure because they attend church, made a profession of faith, were baptized, come from a Christian family, vote Republican, or live in America.
- 7. They do not live by faith; their lives are structured so they never have to. They don't have to trust God if something unexpected happens- they have their savings account.
- **8.** They are not very different than your typical non-believer. They equate their partially sanitized lives with holiness.
