The beginning part of James chapter two focuses on a serious societal problem called partiality. The actual problem is stated in verse one , and then a hypothetical example of this problem is mentioned in verses two through four . Essentially, James said that Christians are called on to be impartial, because God Himself is not a respecter of persons. Reference: Deuteronomy 10:17; Il Chronicles 19:7; Acts 10:34; and Romans 2:11 (see screen)		
God is impartial and as God is, as His children, so are we to be. Next in verses two through four James gives us an example of how some people violate these instructions and do in fact show partiality and favoritism in the church.		
James said favoritism has three basic problems:
