Reference: Esther 7:1-10 Pastor Larry Webb

Definition: Poetic justice is a literary device where a good deed is honored and a bad deed is punished through an ironicof that is related to the character's own conduct.
The Big Idea from Esther chapter seven is "What around around" meaning someone's actions, good or bad, will ultimately have consequences for that person.
It's important not to confuse this principle with the eastern concept of karma.
Definition: Karma implies that all that someone does good or bad counts in how that person is re-born (reincarnated) into his next existence.
Scripture categorically rejects karma and reincarnation. Reference: Hebrews 9:27 , "And it is appointed for men to die once , but after this the judgment"
Hebrews 9:27 emphasizes two things:
Karma doesn't exist but cause and effect do exist. Our actions good or bad ultimately have consequences during this lifetime and that fact is repeated throughout Scripture.
